My godmother used to say, "There, but for the grace of God, go I." It's with heart-breaking clarity that we can see what protection and a few more resources can do for a child! I also hear in my head, that if it's within my power to do something, then I must.

We, at Ancient Ways, are all ready to respond, as we have been since 1994, to the heart-beat of a child's life. Children everywhere teach us what we must do, how we must take action, to make a better world. How can we not?

Ancient Ways is again committing this year to the sponsoring of girls throughout Zimbabwe, to include our Nhimbe for Progress children (50 miles s. of Harare), those in Jangano (90 miles e. of Harare), as well as potentially those in Tese Zvoita (90 miles w. of Harare), with resources and protection for their maturing years.

Monthly Care for Over There

Thank you for your help in being able to reach more teens who are in need of supplies. Our approach is so basic, and yet so personal. It comes at a time that girls tend to feel isolated and alone as they mature, so it's an important puzzle piece. These girls from Jangano share their excitement as they began receiving Monthly Care supplies.

0	CLICK 1	"Tatenda Chaizvo" Thank you, We are going to thank you for the rest of our lives!
N	CLICK 2	"Ve Jangano" We Jangano have come to you now . People with a good message, a good word of hope, cultural and personal freedom.
I	CLICK 3	"Sekuru Vaenda" Now that grandpa has passed on, I am left alone. playing the drum of our traditions. Who else can I be with, in order to sustain this tradition?
N E	CLICK 4	"Chaminuka Ndi Mambo" Chaminuka is King, a Vigilant man, likened to a lion which stays alone in a thick jungle with no fear or worry. (Before colonization Chaminuka was a warrior, spiritual leader and prophet for the people.)

Supplies (bucket, monthly soap, underwear, reusable washable pads) cost under \$15 per girl and will last for years! Please join us in making the basic difference!

One Girl's Life

Vanessa, whose name has been changed here, was 3 years old when she was molested by an uncle, then at 5 years by a neighbor. When she was 8, she went to live with a different uncle and was raped nearly nightly by her cousin, until she asked her mom to bring her home. At 18, she was raped by a nephew and is raising a 5 year-old daughter from that encounter.

Vanessa comes from a family of 8 siblings, 3 of whom have died, and all of whom have HIV, except for herself. She, her daughter, her mom, one of her sisters and her 3 children, all stay together in the high-density suburbs (a township) of a large city, 90 miles west of the capital Harare. They have a 2 room home. That is not a 2-bedroom home...it is 1 bedroom and 1 kitchen...2 rooms. While in college she stays in another town with a roommate for school, while her mother takes care of her daughter. Her father died when she was 3.

Vanessa has been sponsored to go to the University in Zimbabwe. She is completing her 3rd year, which is a time to work in the world. She started as a receptionist for a well-known hotel

and has been promoted to manager recently. Students are not paid for their 40 hour work-week but instead earn college credit. She often has difficulty having enough time to earn any money.

Vanessa's daughter is now ready to enroll in 1st grade. The placements for the 1st term of 2017 were to be paid by the end of November. She did not have the \$76 for first term, and they wouldn't allow her to pay part. We thought her daughter would not be at the school in 2017, but a donor from Ancient Ways paid her fee for that term only.

Vanessa confides in me that she has sometimes done "evil things" to pay for her daughter's school fees or buy the family food. She says that older men have more money, are generous, and she has slept with them so her daughter can stay in school or also to have food to eat. But, she explains further, it makes her sick, mentally/emotionally and then physically. She didn't have the funding for preschool by the deadline, so I have to assume that

this time she did not take the bodyselling path, but it was certainly on her radar of considerations. I guess it becomes, what is the path of least resistance?

Vanessa has so much deep shame from all of the abuse, but can't quite figure out how to heal. She explains that her only hope out of this life, is to graduate, get a degree, and then she can leave her home in Zimbabwe with her daughter. She says the city is corrupt and there are no simple answers.

As Vanessa continues her 4th year of college, her dissertation assignment is to write a book about a project she started. She has chosen to reach out to young girls and do what she can to help them. **The way out is through, and she is finding her own path to healing.** Some might say, but how can she help them when she is in it? And yet, I wonder, who would better understand?

Her Path to Healing

Ancient Ways sponsored her registration with the local city council so that she represents a bonafide community organization now. She can move about without fear of operating outside the law. Depending upon her progress, we may be able to assist her in her mission of "assisting females in the surrounding areas with education, counseling services and wellbeing activities to guarantee a brighter future for all."

Vanessa has named her project "*Tese Zvoita*!" meaning, "Together We Can!" Her vision is to "Build a society, which is sexual abuse free, where people of all ages are educated with the opportunity to grow and heal together." I'm *in* for that!

With just two meetings under their belt, there are 15 girls so far from primary to college level wanting to participate. Vanessa's brother is a traditional music and dance teacher and he is offering to help her. Her sister is an unemployed counselor and also is participating in the meetings and idea pool.

This is one girl's life in Zimbabwe, potentially affecting many with great hope, and healing. *Can you help us help them?*

Deaf Girls

Since the era when Mary Ann Tarr, a hearing specialist, was an Ancient Ways board member, we have had a keener awareness and interest in the deaf children in Zimbabwe. We have facilitated hearing tests and hearing aids for multiple children.

With girls so heavily on our radar now, and through partnerships with Portland Oregon's Sister City in Mutare, we found an organization that is providing a 2 week camp for deaf girls with similar emphasis as our own. We are thrilled to facilitate transport to this camp.

Just Transportation!

We hope to sponsor 8 girls from our various communities. We need to provide them round-trip bus fare with a chaperone from their rural area. **Depending upon the area, the buses cost \$25 to \$50.** The organization has the same dedicated concerns to help the girls, **and its completely free!**

Please sponsor these deaf girls, who otherwise live in an isolated world as they are so rapidly maturing.

Education

It is critical that girls continue in their education. From preschool to University, they benefit greatly from going to school. Studies have shown that the HIV rate falls by half when girls finish primary school. Please join us as we do what we can, to deal with the ever-rising school fees. Even with careful management the costs of the Nhimbe preschool continue to go up for food and supplies. Due to the escalating costs, the compensation for the volunteers is below others in the region.

Hurukuro Natete - Teen Care Camps

89 girls attended the August 2016 winter camp! Your donations helped provide 2 nights and 3 days of food and activities, as well as soaring fires to keep the brownies, rangers and guides warm (sunbeams are too young). With your support we hope to offer these camps 3 times a year. Our food budget included beef, chicken, rice, potatoes, tomatoes, tea, oil, salt, sugar, beverage and biscuits. The girls get involved with the food's preparation and campfire cooking, as well as clean up (yes, all with no running water).

Of great importance is that they will have some special time in *hurukuro natete* which is a unique session where the girls get to talk to the female elders (the *tetes* or aunts) about all of those personal and intimate things they are not supposed to discuss with parents. Culturally it's inappropriate to bring certain information to your parents, like questions about your sexuality, boys, dating, including monthly concerns.

Research Has Shown that play is a critical way to assist children

who are suffering the trauma of war, excess relocation, and economic collapse, etc. Our camps are serving a huge need. Nature walks, sewing, gardening, songs and games are all ways to find and gain balance.

Our goal is to provide an opportunity to run these 3 Care Camps each year during the break, when school is out for 6 weeks. Ideally we can offer this service to not just Nhimbe for Progress, but also to the Jangano's Kiwirirana girls, and maybe the new Tese Zvoita girls as well. **\$5-10 a camp per girl**, depending upon the region, makes a huge difference in their lives. *Thank you for your help with this!*

Our Children Your Children In Zimbabwe

W.A.T.E.R! Wells And Toilets - Everyone's Right!

You most likely grew up taking water from a tap for granted. It takes a few days of camping or traveling in a remote area to really gain an appreciation for water pouring out of the faucet.

The people we work with aren't able to enjoy this privilege. Only 1 in 10 has a pure water well in the Jangano area, 4 in 10 at Nhimbe. It takes about 1,000-1,200 bricks to line a deep hole, that stays put with 5-6 bags of cement. One bag of cement is used for the top to create a lid that prevents groundwater, which carries pathogens and water-borne disease, from flowing into the pure water. After a rain it's particularly critical to have this lid.

These wells cost \$250-\$350, depending upon the region. We have built over 90 wells in the Nhimbe for Progress region where 4 in 10 people have no well. This year we want to provide clean water to Jangano too, but because of the rocky soil of the Dewedzo

Mountains, it will take an extra \$100.

Why Build A Well?

Not only does clean water reduce disease, but think about how much easier it would be to have pure water to wash your clothes and dishes, as well as your body. A well provides the only access to clear clean water, *and* also makes it possible to irrigate.



Prosperity from gardening then becomes a life-saver. Nutritionally, your family eats better, has more variety of vegetables and fruits, and your entire community gets the benefits of your growing expertise. These wells last for generations and serve the extended family, from infants to grandparents, and siblings, living at home due to unemployment *(now estimated at a rate of around 95%.)*

How about it? Please join us in partnering with them as they build wells in 2017!



Recent repainting of wells helped to create that link between you and the family, because your name is painted on the well cap. Gratitude is immense for your help!

Mbira Lessons

Since 2013 we have been providing mbira lessons after school twice a week at the Jangano St. Bedes primary school. The teacher,



Gift Jemwa is 59 years old and a well-known musician in the region and is great with the kids.

By partnering with the nonprofit MBIRA, who provided the instruments, we are supporting not only the children in learning mbira music, but also Gift, his wife Catherine, and their family. The youngest of their four boys is now moving into Form 4, which is the last year of secondary school. Gift is very grateful to share the music while being able to make life better for his family.

A Music Lover

By helping us provide these lessons, the traditional music continues to inspire and teach the young about their culture, and a child is offered the chance to play a musical instrument, a potential life-long passion.

February-March Visit to Zimbabwe

After 5 years, I was able to travel to Zimbabwe and stay for 4 weeks in 2016. Political concerns for their safety and my husband's passing had kept me stateside. Finally, returning to the soil there, was kinesthetically satisfying. Being able to do training, healing work, and have conversations of depth, were all great achievements. Daily texting, although very helpful, is not like a real human voice or touch of a hand!

We Learned Much By Being "On the Ground"

We saw first-hand the things that could not be imagined. We could see the sludge build -up at the bottom of the current well. **Thanks to your donations**, a much needed well-deepening at the preschool was completed this year. This year's drought was staring me in the face the entire time, seeing the browning maize plants that should have been luscious green and loaded with succulent kernels. We also were able to find out more about the preschool roof that leaks. **Thanks to your tremendous support we** will be able to repair it! It was thrilling to get instant responses to my emailed pleas for help from the hut.

Girls Were the Priority on this trip, building the relationship be-

tween our leaders and the young girls. Because of our Girl Guides program we are gratefully intervening on behalf of these maturing girls, to make available the basics. These supplies assure that not only do the girls have healthy and practical options for their menses but also that they have a closer community of peers as well as trusted adults to confide in, regarding their reproductive health and sexual activity.

Our goal is a reduction in five of the threats to teens: pregnancy, HIV, STD transmission, child abuse, and child marriage. During these tender years, we want to share more knowledge about how to navigate hormones, stay focused on school, and engage their creative spirit in their native songs. **Sewing has also become a new past-time,**



as they learned to make monthly care bags for their supplies and a larger patchwork tote for school. Three cheers for hand-sewing skills! Seeing the Girl's Program success was worth the whole trip!

Preschoolers continue to be the heart of Nhimbe, receiving a critical meal

that we provide. Many types of education are taking place with academics and music. And, also the 1st year students need training to use BLAIR toilets because at their homes they use "the bush". They aren't sure what to do in those "little rooms" we use.
